

# Welcome to the Armatus Course 2011 & 2012 For Clergy, Employees and Volunteers

## What is Armatus®?

Armatus® is an internet-based abuse prevention training program developed by Praesidium Inc. The Archdiocese of Portland has chosen Armatus® as the annual training for employees and volunteers after they have participated in the *Called to Protect* class.

## WHO NEEDS TO TAKE THIS COURSE?

- **CLERGY**
- **ALL EMPLOYEES**— who have completed the *Called to Protect* classes.
- **VOLUNTEERS**— who work 4 or more times a year with minors and have completed the *Called to Protect* class.

## How do I find my login and Password?

Your user name is the first initial of your first name and your full last name. For example: Robert Smith's user name would be rsmith, or Sasha Hayes-Jones user name would be shayes-jones.

Your password is the four numerical digits of your birthday, followed by your state abbreviation. For example, if Jane Arnold lives in Oregon and her birthday is March 26, her password would be 0326or.

## How do you get started?
